COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Children who exhibit selective eating habits may be at risk for a range of specific nutrient deficiencies. Research has shown children with special needs, particularly autism spectrum disorders, are at higher risk for nutritional deficiencies due to their limited diets. This course will review specific nutrient deficiencies found in the pediatric population. Strategies and interventions to both prevent and treat deficiencies will be covered.

Keith Williams, PhD, BCBA-D, is the Director of the Feeding Program at the Penn State Hershey Medical Center. He is Professor of Pediatrics at the Penn State College of Medicine. Keith's clinical practice involves the treatment of children with a range of feeding problems. He also conducts research involving feeding problems and childhood nutrition. Keith is the co-author of Treating Eating Problems in Children with Autism Spectrum Disorders and Developmental Disabilities, as well as over 50 articles and book chapters. Keith has a Bachelor's Degree in Psychology and Linguistics from the University of Massachusetts, and a Doctoral Degree in Applied Developmental Psychology from the University of Maryland, Baltimore County. Keith is a licensed psychologist in Pennsylvania and a Board Certified Behavior Analyst - Doctoral Level.
