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### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

An operant analysis of language provides an empirical approach to managing the contingencies that lead to effective communication skills for young children. B.F. Skinner in his book Verbal Behavior (1957) describes several basic verbal operants including the mand, tact, echoic, and intraverbal. While these basic operants occur primarily in interactions that involve complex, multiply-controlled responding, the analysis provides a powerful analytic tool for guiding practical interventions relative to the development of pragmatic language skills. This training will provide an overview of both the basic verbal operants and their relation to the early acquisition of communicative competencies. Included will be a discussion of the structure of intervention that includes sensitivity to environment-behavior relations to foster language development. A review of assessment issues, including a discussion of the structure, components and administration considerations for the Verbal Behavior Milestones Assessment and Placement Program (VB-MAPP) will be included to assist early intervention practitioners in formulating effective language interventions. Emphasis will be on developing skill sets for learners during the infant through five-year age range. Methods of Instruction: Lecture, Powerpoint, handouts, videos, question and answer.

#### ABOUT OUR PRESENTER:

Mike Miklos, MS, BCBA, is a behavior analyst and Pennsylvania certified school psychologist employed as an educational consultant for the Pennsylvania Training and Technical Assistance Network (PAT-TAN). His responsibilities have included training staff, developing systems for data-driven decisions, completing functional behavior assessments, program review, and consultant training. He continues to provide site-based training and consultation related to autism support services and special education. His work has included an emphasis on the application of an analysis of verbal behavior to interventions for individuals with autism. In collaboration with a team of educational and behavioral specialists, he has developed and delivered competency based trainings to thousands of participants from Pennsylvania, across the United States, and internationally. Currently, Mr. Miklos serves as statewide lead consultant for the PaTTAN Autism Initiative and coordinates efforts for the PaTTAN Autism Initiative ABA Supports and the National Autism Conference. He has made presentations and provided competency-based trainings regarding educational interventions, behavior analysis, and autism across the United States, in Beijing, China; Warsaw, Poland; Naples, Italy; Prague, Czech Republic; and Bratislava and Kosice, Slovakia. In his role as Lead Consultant for the PATTAN Autism Initiative, he has led a team in developing a series of training videos and resources that are accessed across the United States and worldwide.

- 4. Analyze performance patterns for various levels of proficiency relative to the verbal operants and discuss implications for program planning.
